Bachelor of Arts Degree Awarded: Total Hours 120

Ursuline College requires a minimum of 120 total credit hours for graduation. At least 50% of the students major must be completed as the residency requirement at Ursuline College. All Ursuline Core requirements, general requirements, and all requirements for the major must be completed along with a cumulative grade point of average of at least 2.0 for graduation. Students deficient in total credits, residency requirements, or in minimum cumulative grade point average must take additional elective credits to meet the minimum requirements.

Students who qualify under the Articulation Agreement with Tri-C may be eligible to have two distribution classes waived. Contact an admission counselor at Ursuline College to see if you qualify.
