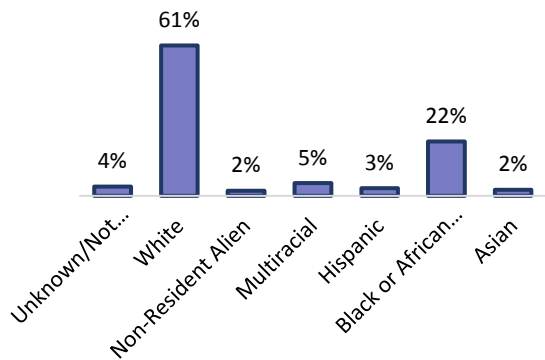

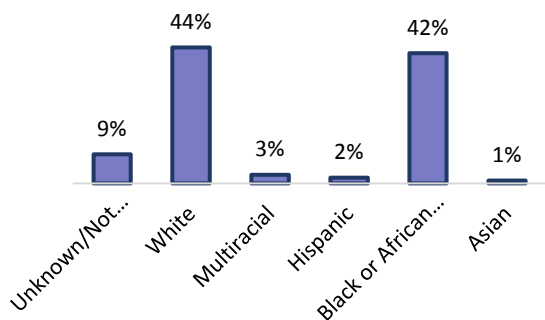

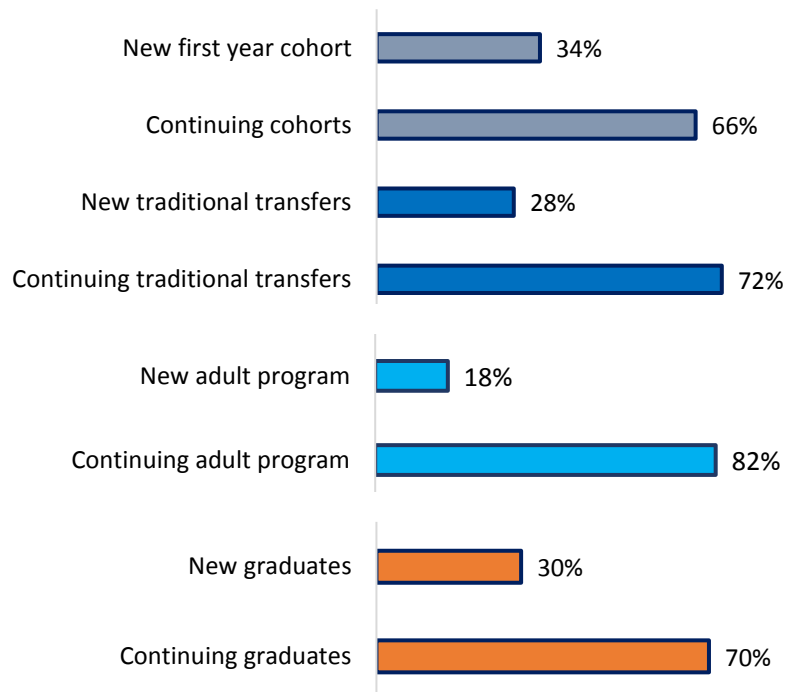
Race/Ethnicity - Traditional UG



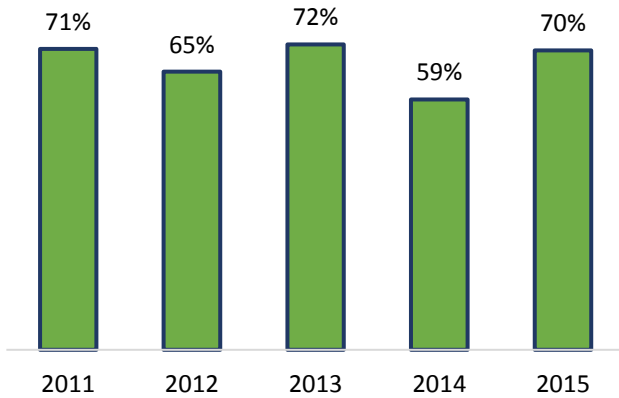
Race/Ethnicity - Adult UG Program



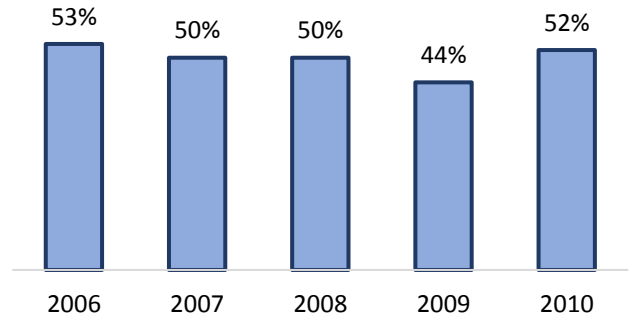
Degree-seeking Population



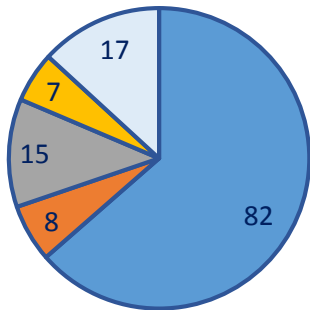
Retention to Second Year, First Year Students



Trend of Graduation Rate, First Year Students

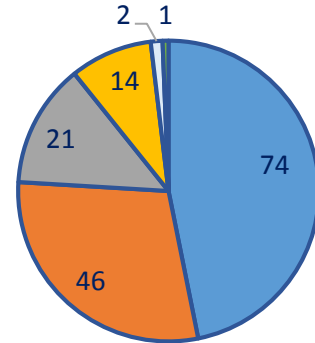


Top Five Bachelor's Degrees - 2016
