



**Stop Campus Hazing Act- Bi-Annual Campus Hazing Transparency Report (CHTR)  
July 1, 2025- December 23, 2025**

**A) Statistics Report:**

Ursuline College has no hazing incidents to report for July 1, 2025, through December 23, 2025. In the event there are future incidents to report, the following information will be listed.

- The name of the student organization
- A general description of the violation that resulted in a finding or responsibility, including whether the violation involved the abuse or illegal use of alcohol or drugs, the findings of the institution, and any sanctions placed on the student organization by the institution
- The dates on which the incident was alleged to have occurred
- The date on which the investigation into the incident was initiated
- The date the investigation ended with a finding that a hazing violation occurred
- The date the institution provided notice to the student organization that the incident resulted in a hazing violation

**B) How to Report Incidents of Hazing<sup>1</sup>**

Making an intentionally false report or accusation of hazing is prohibited and may be subject to disciplinary action pursuant to the Student Code of Conduct.

Campus security authorities are required to promptly report incidents of Hazing, as defined by the Stop Campus Hazing Act, to campus security.
